Aussie Reds and Penfolds



Dan Baldock, Penfolds' Wine Educator, gave us a superb presentation during which we learned about the history of Penfolds and their different ranges of wines. It was very interesting to learn that the Australians pay more for a bottle of Grange than we do!

The comparison between the entry-level Thomas Hyland and the Bin range showed that, for a few more dollars, you can purchase a high quality wine which can be cellared for many years. Penfolds will even do a quality inspection of your 15 years + wine at one of their 'Re-corking clinics' which they expect to hold in Wellington every couple of years.

The highlight of the evening was the comparative tasting of the 1996, 2000 and 2004 Bin 28 Kalimna Shiraz. We acknowledge Alan Evans' generosity in making the 1996 wine available from his cellar. Unfortunately Alan could not be present but we have told him how good that wine is.

We are very grateful to Dan and hope to invite him back in the future.

Wine may protect against radiation

A natural antioxidant commonly found in red wine and fruit may protect against radiation exposure, US researchers have reported.

Tests in mice showed that resveratrol, when altered using a compound called acetyl, could prevent some of the damage caused by radiation, the researchers told the American Society for Therapeutic Radiology and Oncology meeting in Boston.

Drugs made that way might be used in a large-scale radiological or nuclear emergency, said Dr Joel Greenberger, a radiation oncologist at Johns Hopkins University in Baltimore.

"Currently there are no drugs on the market that protect against or counteract radiation exposure," he added. "Our goal is to develop treatments for the general population that are effective and nontoxic," Greenberger said in a statement.

"Small molecules which can be easily stored, transported and administered are optimal for this, and so far acetylated resveratrol fits these requirements well."

Winemakers fly flag

Two Blenheim winemakers are flying the flag for New Zealand at an Australasian competition.

Vavasour Wines Marlborough winemaker Stuart Marfell and Auntsfield Estate winemaker Lucas Cowley are finalists in The Wine Society Young Winemaker of the Year Award. This is the second year New Zealanders have been selected as finalists in the Australasian award. Marlburian Josh Scott was the first ever New Zealander to be included.

The 10 finalists will each have their top two wines judges by a panel of industry representatives over the next two months. Mr Marfell and Mr Cowley will fly to Sydney for the awards on November 1.

Palin wine caught up in US election

Palin Syrah, a small organic wine from Chile, has found itself embroiled in the turmoil surrounding the Republican campaign in the US presidential race.

The wine, linked, for obvious reasons, with Republican vice-president candidate Sarah Palin, has drawn media attention in the US. News organizations in the country are tracking sales of the brand and connecting the label's fortunes to the popularity of Palin's right-wing politics.

Chris Tavelli, a partner in San Francisco's Yield Wine Bar started serving Palin Syrah before Republican presidential candidate John McCain asked Palin to be his running-mate. Following Palin's nomination, sales of the wine plummeted in liberal San Francisco. But Tavelli is reluctant to take it off his wine list.

The bar's proprietors have invited customers to write in their own impressions of the wine. Recent popular descriptors include 'moose meat', 'gunpowder' and 'hockey mom' – all words associated with Sarah Palin.
