# Glancing Back - Festive Champagne Evening



Forty-four members and guests enjoyed this meeting which was hosted at Glengarry's Cask Room. It continued the "bubbles" tradition established over recent years, but this year with a difference. Allan Scott from Allan Scott Wines in Marlborough jointly hosted the evening in

conjunction with Vaughan Hooper of Glengarry's. The evening was divided into two sections, the range of Allan Scott "bubbles" and then the four champagnes of the evening.

Allan reflected on his company's distinguished wine heritage, their more recent ventures into Methode styles and the recent advent of sparkling Sauvignon Blanc. This wine as our "mingling" wine and won many friends. It was followed by three non vintage styles: the Blanc de Blanc, the "Cecilia" Reserve Brut and, to conclude, the Les Joues Rouge Sparkling Rose.

From 100% chardonnay, the blanc de blanc was a wine that captured the attention of most present. With its layers of obvious pinot noir and being in a more classical and familiar style, the "Cecilia" reserve brut proved to be an acclaimed favourite. Sparkling rose is a new addition for the winery and was the wine in the flight that generated perhaps most discussion.

Vaughan presented the four champagnes, all distributed by Glengarry's, in the second half of the evening. Does price matter with champagne? It does, but more so the house style is what captures the attention. We were treated to wonderful examples: three non vintage and a sensational vintage 2002 Drappier.

Each of the NV styles was both discernable and distinctive. The Piper Heidsieck Cuvee Brut was popular and at the current price had a strong following. It is a recognisable wine and many indicated their familiarity with the style. A number present indicated they would be looking for this for sure. Charles Heidsieck Brut Reserve was a standout wine, something really special and displaying a great flavour spectrum and appeal. Nicholas Feuillatte Brut Reserve was one for the purist, least known, but a house style to enjoy that was different and a privilege to try.

The 2002 Drappier Grand Sendree was a standout. Those present took little persuading that this was a \$100 vintage wine. It culminated the evening well and "saving the best till last" certainly still has its place.

Our thanks go to Glengarry's for hosting and Vaughan Hooper for showcasing the evening for us. We look forward to continuing this association that has been a feature of the club's annual tasting calendar. Be determined to enjoy your bubbles this Christmas.
