Haythornthwaite Wines, a boutique vineyard of 11 acres in Martinborough, is owned by Cellar Club members Mark and Susan Haythornthwaite. Their focus is on quality rather than quantity. The vineyard is located on the ancient alluvial river terraces of Martinborough which are made up of deep, free-draining gravel overlaid with a gravelly silt loam.

First plantings were in 1992 and the first vintage was 1997 with the release of a Pinot Noir. However, Gewürztraminer is their passion and Mark and Susan have received many medals for this varietal. In August this year at the Bragato Awards the 2008 Gewürztraminer was awarded a Bronze medal, and the 2009 vintage won a Gold medal and was awarded the trophy for the Champion Dessert Wine of the Show.

### Marlborough wine offerings tops

### Marlborough wines won the lion's share of medals at the 2009 New World Wine Awards.

Stoneleigh Marlborough Chardonnay 2008 was named the best white wine, Montana Reserve Chardonnay Pinot Brut Cuvee the best sparkling wine and Australian wine Grant Burge Miamba Shiraz 2007 the best red wine. Marlborough won 144 medals: eight gold, 35 silver and 101 bronze out of 289 entries. All wines entered had to retail for below \$25 per bottle and have at least 500 cases of each wine available for sale.

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## NZ achieves \$1 billion wine export milestone

**New Zealand Winegrowers announced the wine industry has achieved its milestone of \$1 billion in exports, a year ahead of schedule.**

Chief executive of New Zealand Winegrowers, Philip Gregan, said the industry exported \$1.01 billion of wine in the year to 31 July 2009, according to Statistics New Zealand. \$1 billion in wine exports is the equivalent of five bottles per second.

"The phenomenal long-term growth of New Zealand wine exports has been based on a industry-wide commitment to world class quality, in our vineyards, in our wineries and in our marketing and sales efforts."

A 2009 report from New Zealand Institute of Economic Research showed wine exports have grown at a compound rate of nearly 24% (23.8%) each year for the past 20 years, four times the growth rate for all goods exports.

Wine exports represent 2.2% of total goods exports and the industry supports 16,500 full-time jobs. The industry contributes more than \$1.5 billion to New Zealand's GDP.

"New Zealand wine still has enormous opportunity globally with strong demand from key markets, notably Australia, the United Kingdom and the United States, as well as increasingly from Asian and continental European markets."

## Region rallies to help victims

**Marlborough is preparing to rally around its Samoan and Tongan communities as they wait to hear from their families affected by the recent tsunami.**

The region's wine industry, churches and service groups are considering how they can help.

Wine Marlborough marketing manager Marcus Pickens said the organisation hoped to speak with contractors and Pacific liaison workers to find out how best to help tsunami victims.

New Zealand Winegrowers chairman Stuart Smith said he was sure something would be done, but at this stage people were just stunned by what had happened.

"We are certainly well aware of the contributions that people from those parts make to the wine industry and the number of permanent residents who live in New Zealand."
