Please note the departure from November Bubbles evenings of recent years where we have been hosted by Glengarry Wines in Thorndon Quay. **This year we are hosting the event ourselves at the usual Community Centre venue**. We have also been able to source wine flutes for the night, and can use the Club glasses for the still wines, so it is not necessary to bring your own glasses.

In the first half of the meeting John will showcase Forrest wines with "the Doctor's Riesling" as a quaffer and a Rose as a second quaffer or first off the rank. He will also present 3 bubbles; Brigit, Doctors Remedy and Bubbles for Beth.

In the second half of the meeting we will sample a Duval-Leroy Fleur De Champagne, a Jean Marc Vigreux Frere, and a Mumm Cordon Rouge Brut NV. John will be asked to provide comment on these wines. At the end of the evening John will present his botrytis Riesling.

You will appreciate that the above list represents a wider range of tasting than normal. Also with "bubbles" it is more difficult to be precise about measures. We would ask those attending to have some regard for this and ensure that; they eat well before coming to the tasting, if necessary they make arrangements to be picked up or if one of a party to designate a driver. Driving after tasting up to 9 wines could be perilous. Be careful. And don't forget you need to email Robin if you want to attend the November "Bubbles" meeting. Numbers will be controlled so that there will be sufficient wine and nibbles available for those attending the tasting.

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
